The Restoration of the John Vogler House Windows

Our Mission:

Old Salem Museums & Gardens presents an authentic view of the rich cultural history of early Southern life to diverse audiences—with special emphasis on the Moravians in North Carolina—through the preservation and interpretation of historic objects, buildings, and landscapes.

About Old Salem Museums & Gardens:

In 1950, a group of dedicated volunteers established Old Salem, Inc. to begin preserving and restoring the town of Salem for future generations. As Old Salem grew, more buildings were restored, and new facilities were added—including the Museum of Early Southern Decorative Arts (MESDA).

In addition to having two National Historic Landmark buildings, the Salem Tavern and the Single Brother's Hose, Old Salem was designated as a National Historic Landmark (NHL) in 1966, and its boundaries were redefined in the 1970s. Old Salem has worked since the 1990s to expand the historic district to encompass the broader Moravian experience and influence more comprehensively. In 2016 the National Park Service approved an expansion of the NHL district, including changes to the boundaries, additional time periods of significance and more types of resources.

Old Salem attracts approximately 440,000 visitors annually, including 45,000 school children. The museums and have a regional economic impact of over \$48 million a year and generate \$3.34 million in tax revenues for the state and county.

Adjacent to the historic district is Salem College with enrollment of 940 students and an additional 100 families that live in Salem.



J. Vogler House, 700 South Main Street on the Square

Constructed 1819; restored 1955

John Vogler and his new wife Christina Spach moved into this house on Salem Square when it was finished in 1819. John was a silversmith and clock repairer. He was active in Salem's community through service on church boards and leadership in the Sunday School movement. John and Christina had three children, Lisetta, Louisa, and Elias.

The Vogler House features the family's public and private living spaces along with John's shop and a scullery housing a bake oven and smithy. Many furnishings are original to the Vogler family.

The house was architecturally seminal as one of the first to follow emerging American national styles in Salem, most residences to that point had been based on traditional Germanic forms and plans. There is a pedimented hood over the front door with a painted clock face reflecting his trade. The house is one of Old Salem's most important and beloved structures.

INTRODUCTION

This Request for Proposal, "RFP" was developed to perform a request for proposal for restoring the windows in the John Vogler House in the **Old Salem Museums & Gardens** Historic District. The purpose of this document is to define the process for evaluation and request information that will assist us in reviewing and/or selecting compatible candidates.

DESCRIPTION

The John Vogler House windows and main entry doors are in need of restoration to include some or all of the following:

- Stripping of outside paint.
- Wood repaired and/or replaced where needed. Repair over replacement is preferred in retaining as much original wood as reasonable.
- If broken, glass windowpanes replaced with restoration glass or with period glass that we have available.
- Glass windowpanes re-glazed, #7 or triangular push points preferred.
- Primer coat of outside paint applied.
- Windows can be removed for the work to be done off-site and brought back to the house for installation.
- With this being one of the most prominent buildings on Salem Square, windows removed should be replaced as soon as possible.
- Existing/Historic hardware or shadowing to be retained and reviewed, before any removal or patch.
- Photos of the current window conditions are at the end of this document. You are also welcome to inspect the building in person.
- Project goal is fully operational windows, as much as possible for individual windows/locations. To be reviewed case by case.

Window and door count is as follows: Two entry doors (front and back of center hallway), 31 total windows:

- 21 (15 Pane)
- 6 (12 Pane)
- 1 (4 Pane)
- 1 (10 Pane)
- 2 (Transoms)
